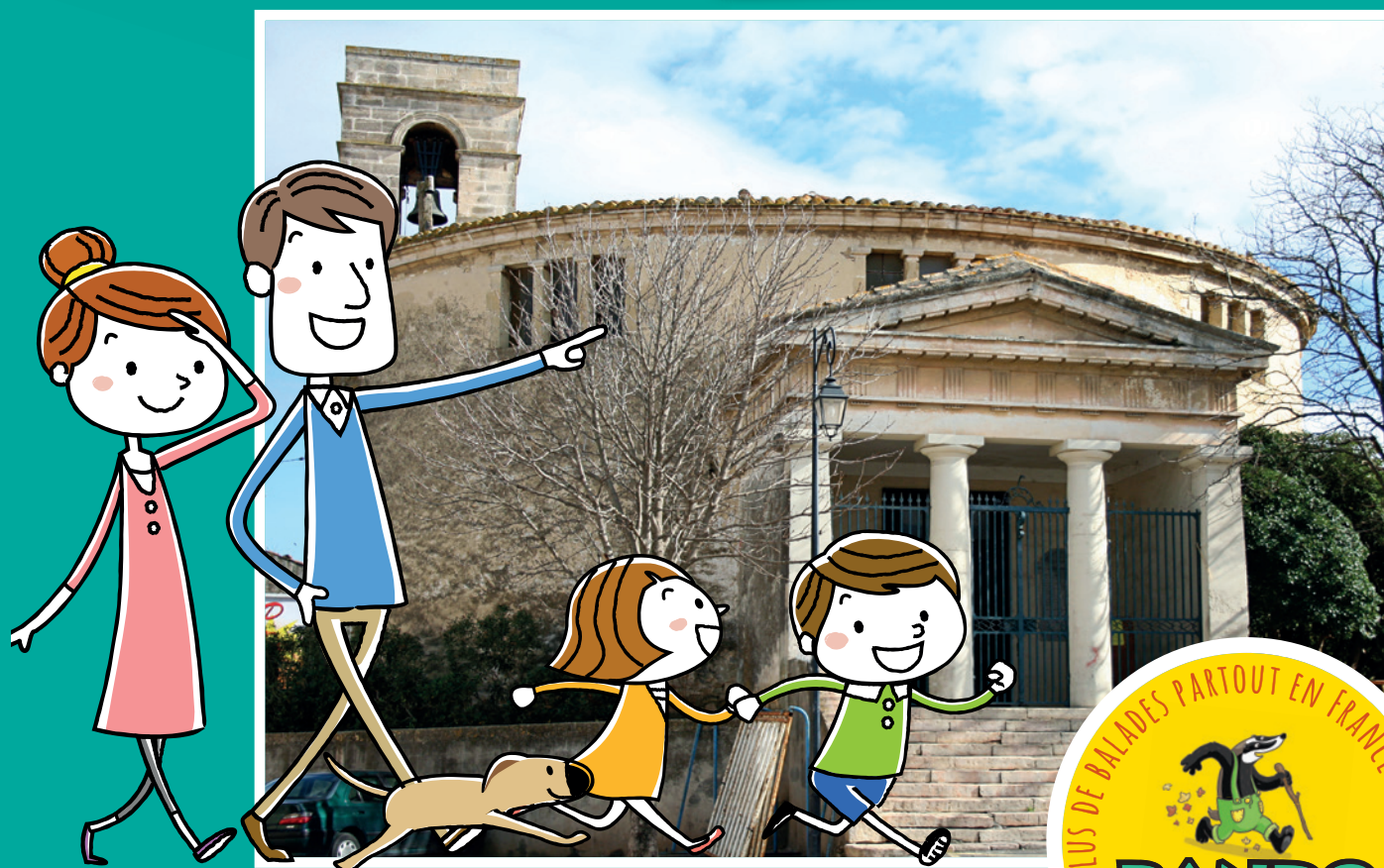

Start the walk in front of the town hall

➤ 1

Look at the clock and then take the Rue de l'Horloge going up. Notice the wine press ➤ 2

Then look at the church ➤ 3

Go back towards the town hall, rue de la Carrierasse. Pass in front of the library and observe the house at n° 113 ➤ 4

Afterwards, notice the fresco at the corner of the the next street ➤ 5

Then go and look at the temple ➤ 6

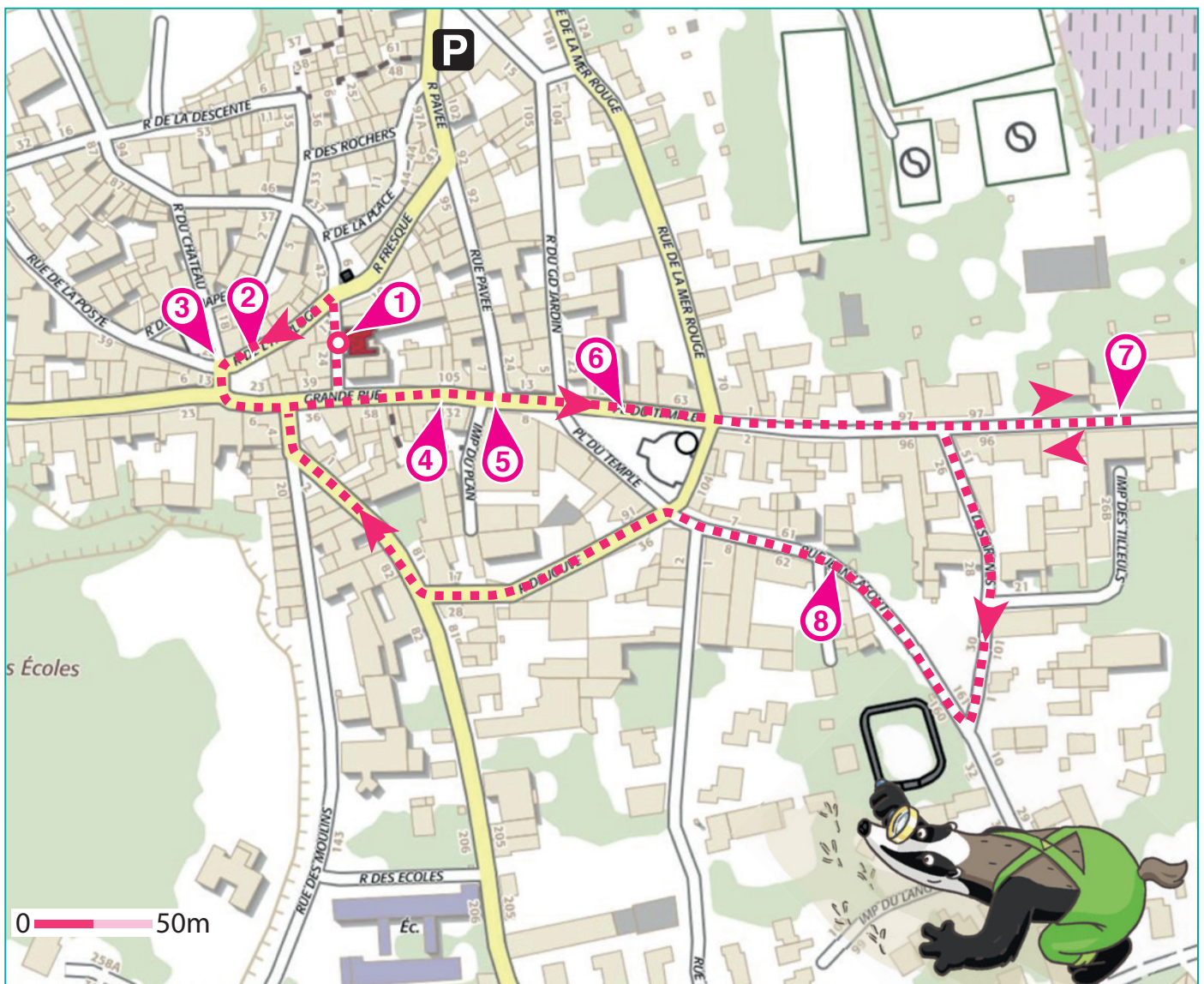
Continue down the street to the left of the the temple, rue de Banloux, and continue until you see the entrance to

the restaurant Les Aubades to discover the oldest "empègue" in the village ➤ 7

Turn around and take the first street on the left. Go to the arena and then turn right into rue Jean Lafont. Observe the door n° 53 ➤ 8

Arriving at the temple, turn left into the rue de Jouve and then right into rue de Menussargues.

At the end of the street, turn right to the town hall and finish the walk.

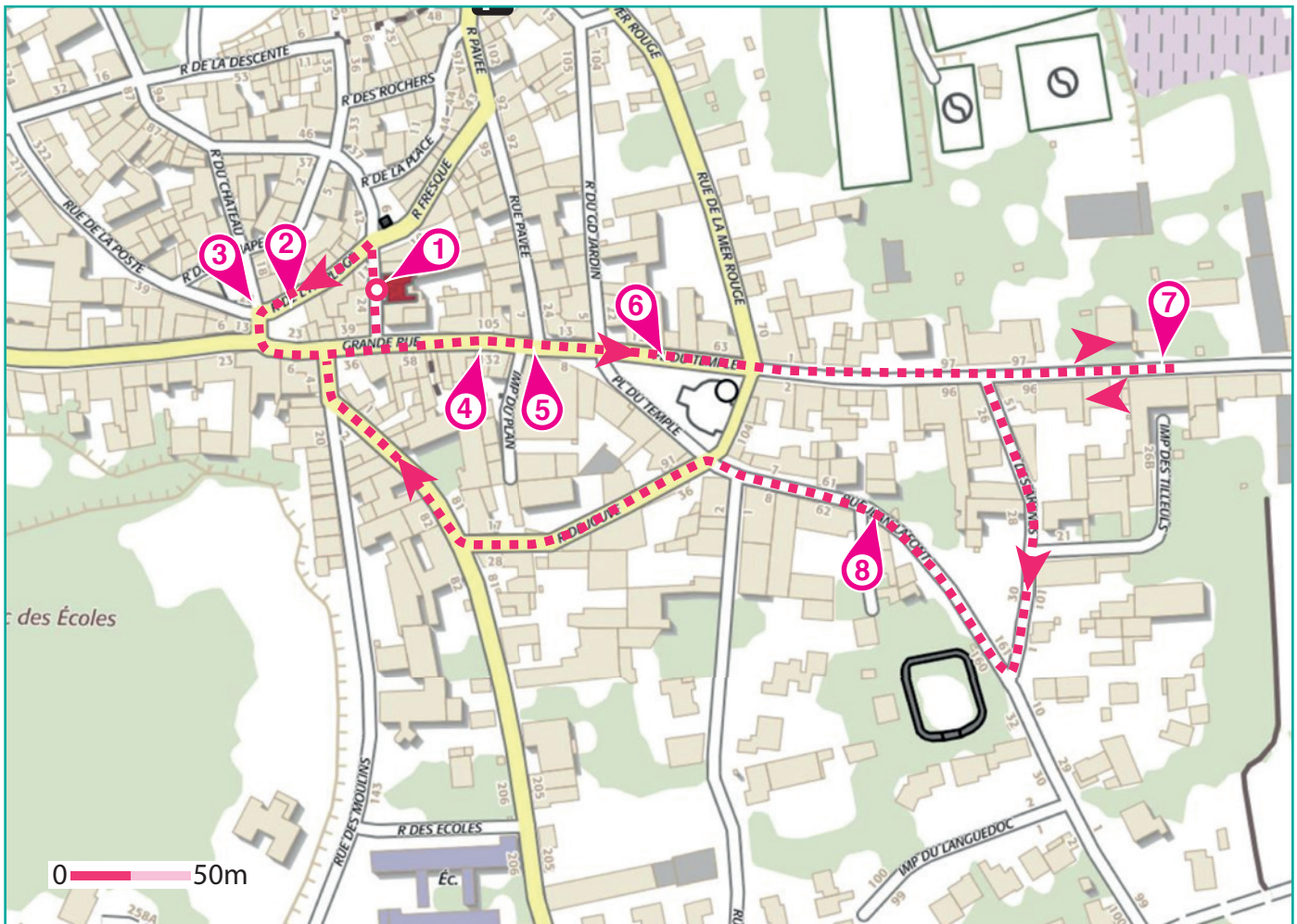
RIDDLE

The Camargue owes much to this character who made the manades (free herds of bulls or horses) the trademark of the territory. During the European tour of a certain Buffalo Bill, his gardians (or herdsmen) even took part in the shows featuring Indians and with Indians and cowboys. In the commune of Beauvoisin, they honoured him by naming a street after him.

The identity of this man interests Inspector Rando. Help him to find out the first and last name of this manadier!

As curious as ever, Inspector Rando needs your help in this search to discover the identity of the creator of the Camargue cross.

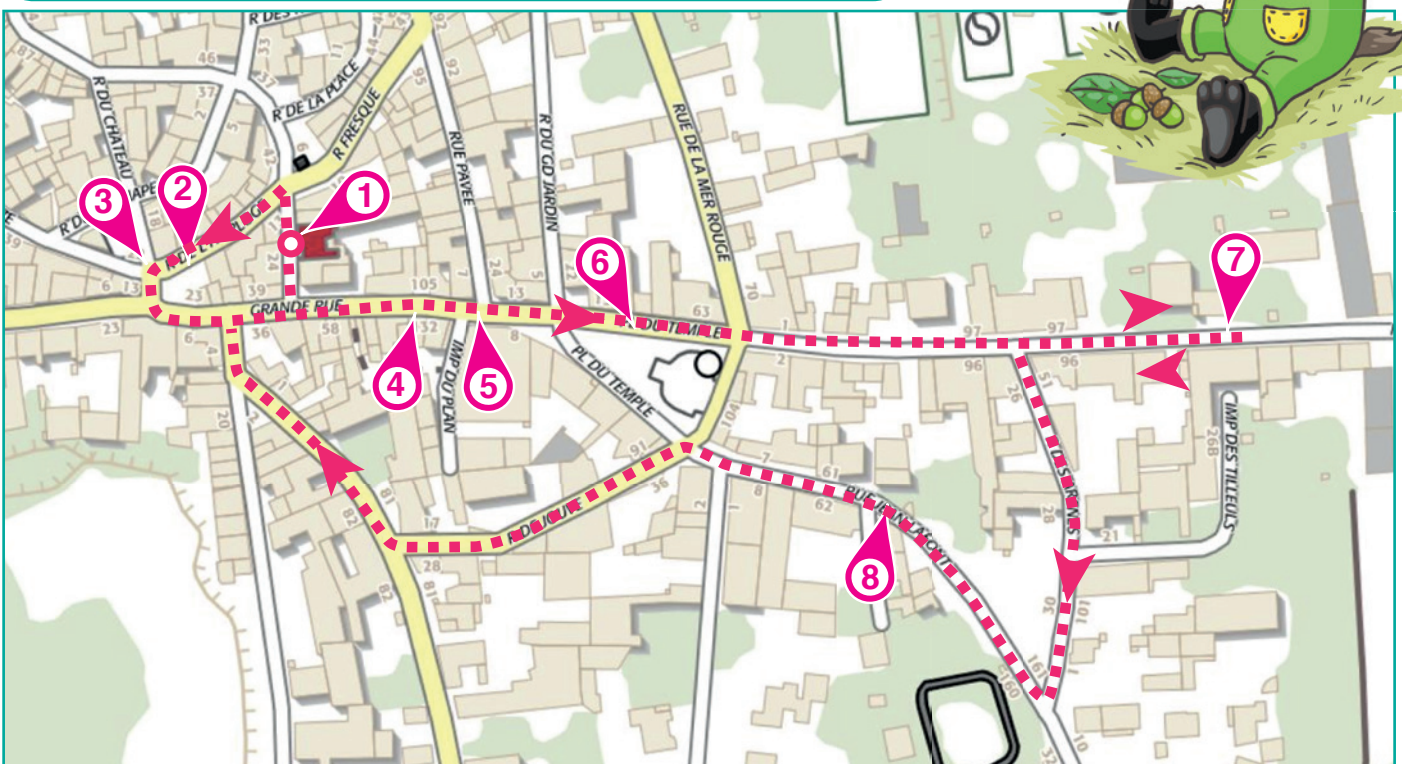

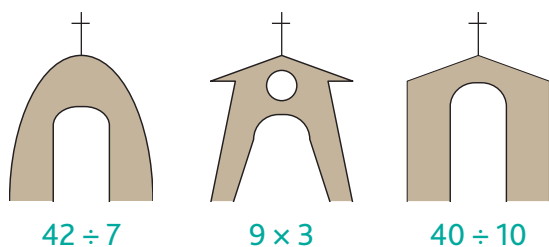
